Subject: **Flood Warning**

Flood Forecasting Division (FFD) has informed **VERY HIGH and ABOVE** Level flooding is likely to continue in River Kabul at Nowshera **during next 24 hours**. River Indus at Kalabagh & Chashma is likely to attain **HIGH TO VERY HIGH** Flood level during **next 24 to 48 hours**. Copy of FFD Bulletin No. A-074/22 & C-074/22 dated 27 August 2022 is attached as **Annex-A & B**. All concerned Federal Ministries / Departments, All PDMAs, Irrigation Departments, Respective District Administrations / DDMA's, Municipal / City Administrations are advised to ensure following: -

- a. Maintain enhanced alert level / monitoring of developing situation to reduce reaction / response times.
- b. All civic agencies / rescue services (Rescue 1122 / Fire Brigade / Ambulance / Civil Defense) to remain alert and ensure availability of personnel and equipment in at-risk areas during the forecasted period.
- c. People living along the banks of Rivers and in vicinity of nullahs to be sensitized about expected increase of water flows.
- d. Timely evacuation of at-risk population from low-lying / flood prone areas as per Evacuation Plans and ensure availability of shelters, food and medicines in those shelter camps.
- e. Locals / farmers / cattle herders be forewarned to shift cattle away from low lying areas adjacent to Rivers and in vicinity of rivers.
- f. Restrict vehicle movement in low lying / at-risk location, in the vicinity of rivers/ nullahs.
- g. Provision of relief / medical supplies to affectees in timely manner.
- h. Coordinate with concerned departments for clearance of roads in case of any blockage / obstruction, waterlogging and pre-placing of necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable / appropriate locations.

- i. Travelers and Tourists are forewarned about risks posed by floods in vulnerable locations and may be diverted to safe lay-by / waiting areas with sufficient supply of water / food and essential medicines in case of adverse / dangerous road conditions by Police, NH&MP and Local Administrations.
 - j. In case of any eventuality, special SITREP / update be shared immediately with NDMA.

SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD/WEATHER FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION (AT 0600 PST):

- River Kabul at Nowshera is in **VERY HIGH FLOOD**, River Indus at Taunsa & Sukkur and is in High Flood Level, River Indus at Chashma, Guddu & Kotri is in Medium Flood Level and at Tarbela & Kalabagh is in low Flood Level.
- Present **HIGH TO VERY HIGH-level flooding in Tributaries of Rivers Kabul & Indus is likely to subside significantly during next 24-hours.**

(WARNING)

- **VERY HIGH and Above level flooding is likely to continue in River Kabul at Nowshera during next 24-hours.**
- **River Indus at Kalabagh & Chashma is likely to attain HIGH TO VERY HIGH flood level during next 24 to 48 hours.**

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

- a) Yesterday's Low-pressure area over South of Jacobabad has become insignificant.
- b) Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northern parts of the country persists and has weakened.
- c) Weak Seasonal low lies over West Balochistan.
- d) Weak Moist currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating over Northeast Punjab up to 3000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Mainly dry weather is expected over most parts of the country, however Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Northeast Balochistan and DG Khan, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala & Lahore Divisions.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR FURTHER-24 HOURS:

No significant change.

CATCHMENTS (28th August, 2022 to 03rd September, 2022)**

➤ **RAINFALL OUTLOOK:**

No significant rainfall is expected.

➤ **FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:**

- River Indus at Kalabagh & Chashma is likely to attain HIGH TO VERY HIGH flood level during next 24 to 48 hours.
- River Indus at Taunsa, Guddu & Sukkur may attain high flood level during the period.
- No High Flood situation is expected in Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej.
