- 5. <u>Helicopter/ Aerial Rescue Operations</u>. 10x Helis were used for conduct of 39 sorties (33 in KP, 5 in Punjab and 1 in Sindh). 505 people were evacuated, 23.2 tons of food and relief items were distributed among flood affected people.
